This residential school through a holistic approach, fosters an environment where every child, regardless of ability, can thrive, gain independence, and contribute meaningfully to society.



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VISHWANATH SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYA

IHRF supports the **Vishwanath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya Association**, an esteemed institution dedicated to the preservation and promotion of Sanskrit education and Vedic wisdom. With approximately 300 students, the Mahavidyalaya provides a comprehensive curriculum that blends traditional Sanskrit learning with modern subjects, ensuring a well-rounded education. Half of the students are residential students who are provided room and board on campus. Students are immersed in Vedic philosophy, rituals, and Indian heritage, while also engaging in yoga, environmental awareness programs, and community service. Through this initiative, IHRF continues its commitment to nurturing scholars, sustaining India's rich cultural and spiritual traditions, and empowering the next generation of Sanskrit intellectuals and leaders.



KANVASHRAM GURUKUL

Nestled in the tranquil landscapes of *Kotdwar*, *Uttarakhand*, **Kanvashram Gurukul is** run by IHRF and stands as a revered sanctuary of Vaidic knowledge, spiritual practice, and holistic living. Deeply intertwined with the sacred heritage of Bharat, this historic ashram carries the legacy of Rishi Kanva, the great sage after whom it is named. According to ancient scriptures, Kanvashram is the very place where Shakuntala, the mother of Emperor Bharata, was raised, making it a site of immense historical and cultural significance.

Today, the Gurukul continues to uphold the legacy of Vaidic Culture by offering a nurturing space for students and seekers to immerse themselves in Sanskrit studies, meditation, self-discipline, and eco-conscious living.

KANYA GURUKUL

IHRF also supports the **Kanya Gurukul in Delhi**, providing a nurturing environment for over 20 young girls in its first phase with plans to expand. Here they receive a traditional yet holistic education rooted in Indian culture and values. Along with Vedic studies, yoga, and self-development, the Gurukul emphasizes Swachhta (cleanliness) and environmental awareness, integrating eco-conscious living into daily practices. The students actively participate in tree plantation drives, waste management initiatives, and water conservation efforts, fostering a deep respect for nature.



Through this initiative, IHRF empowers young girls with knowledge, discipline, and a commitment to sustainability, ensuring they grow into confident, compassionate, and environmentally responsible individuals.

ORGANIC FARMING & TREE PLANTATION

IHRF also supports runs the Najibabad, Dist: Bijnaur, Uttar Pradesh and Ajitpur, Dist: Haridwar, Uttarakhand farms through farmers and sevaks, who are dedicated to organic farming and sustainable agriculture. These farms play a crucial role in nourishing and sustaining the institutions and organizations that IHRF supports, ensuring access to pure, natural, and sattvic food.

SHRI YOG SHAKTI PEETH GURUKUL

Currently, the ashram supports fifty students and about ten teachers/staff, offering them a nurturing environment where they receive not just academic education but also values-based training, empowering them to become responsible and enlightened individuals who contribute positively to society.

DIVINE SHAKTI FOUNDATION

In collaboration with the Divine Shakti Foundation, IHRF supports multiple educational and vocational training centers in Rishikesh. Including but not limited to **Parmarth Vidya Mandir**, dedicated to providing quality education to underprivileged children, equipping them with academic knowledge, moral values, and practical skills. **Parmarth Nari Sashakti Kendra**, a women's empowerment initiative that offers vocational training and skill development, including tailoring, handicrafts, computer literacy, and entrepreneurship courses. Additionally, IHRF supports other schools and vocational training centers that promote community-based education and sustainable livelihood opportunities for marginalized groups.
